Places to shop

Market Place

The centre of Loughborough where the famous 'Sockman' stands. The Market Place is home to our popular markets held every Thursday and Saturday as well as high street retailers such as Topshop, Dorothy Perkins, Primark and Boots. On event days, live entertainment takes place in the Market Place, such as street artists, fairground rides, and concerts. More information on these events can be found at the Visitor Services Centre at the Town Hall, an entertainment venue with something for everyone; family shows, comedy, theatre, literature and celebratory talks and a wide range of music and events.

Carillon Court

A lively shopping centre with 340 parking spaces, including high street retailers such as Next, Game, New Look and The Body Shop. It is also home to one-off boutiques, and well established stores such as Tylers, selling quality furnishings and gift wear. A short walk from Queen's Park, Carillon Court sits in an accessible, central spot with entrances from the Market Place, Market Street and Swan Street.



Churchgate

A wonderful, quaint street of several individually-owned, unique boutiques and galleries selling a range of exclusive goods. These include jewellery, women's and men's fashions, home furnishings, gifts and art works. The street also has a range of places to eat and relax and watch the world go by. Churchgate Mews, with a distinct rustic framework, branches off through a narrow street, offering several more delightful independent shops.

Devonshire Square

Home to the local bric-a-brac market held on a Friday and farmer's market every 2nd Wednesday of the month.

Market Street

This street links the town centre to Carillon Court with local fashion shops, bookshops, pubs, Costa Coffee and friendly local cafés.

Cattle Market

An historic Market street leading into the Market Place, which hosts the regular market on Thursday and Saturday. The local REEL cinema is also here. It is one of the largest independent modern cinemas in the country and is part of an historic Art Deco building.

Regent Place

Loughborough's Retail Outdoor Complex including Curry's, Carphone Warehouse and KFC. Parking is available on site and is within walking distance from the Market Place.

The Rushes

A modern, outdoor shopping complex including Marks and Spencer, JJB Sports, TK Maxx, Cargo and LA Fitness. There are 450 parking spaces available onsite and is well priced.



High Street and Swan Street

Loughborough's main streets through the town centre. The High Street merges with one of the town's main access routes, the A6, providing easy access to those living outside the borough. Both streets have their own selection of high street retailers such as Burton Menswear, Argos, McDonalds and Wilkinson's.

Wards End

Devonshire Square leads to Wards End where more interesting, independent shops and a number of pubs can be found, plus handy parking.

Places of Interest

Great Central Railway

Great Central Railway on Great Central Road provides tranquil steam engine rides between Loughborough and Leicester.

Heritage Parks experience

Queens Park was opened to celebrate Queen Victoria's diamond jubilee and is as popular now as it was on opening as a place to play and relax. It is also home to Charnwood Museum, an award winning museum exploring the history of Charnwood with regular changing exhibitions, a café and a shop. The Park also boasts a delightful duck pond, aviary, and bandstand as well as the Carillon. Take time to climb the 151 foot-high War Memorial Tower for wonderful views of the town and Charnwood Forest, listen to the Carillon bells and take in the First World War exhibits.

John Taylor Bell Foundry Museum

This fascinating museum on Freehold Street is part of the world's largest bell foundry and made the bells for Loughborough's very own Carillon as well as St Paul's Cathedral. Tours of the works showing how the bells are made are available on specific days.

Special Events Not to be Missed...

- **Christmas Programme** - Christmas Light Switch on, last Sunday of November.
- **Loughborough Fair** - Held yearly, second Wednesday- Saturday in November
