## **1. Licensing qualifications**

Licensing qualifications are dealt with in section 120(8) and (9) of the Licensing Act 2003.

At present, the only accredited qualifications that are acceptable are the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders, Accreditation Number 100/4866/2; GOAL Level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders, Accreditation Number 100/4865/0; and the GQAL Level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders, Accreditation Number 100/5040/1.

Failure to do so without reasonable excuse could lead to prosecution and a fine not exceeding level 4 on the standard scale [£2,500].
