Place Survey (Pilot Exercise) 2008

Final Report

I. Introduction

This consultation was carried out by the Communications, Consultations and Partnerships Team in April – May 2008 as part of the Council's desire to effectively engage with our communities and act upon the outcomes to ensure we are developing services that meet their needs.

The aims of the survey were as follows:

- To test logistical and resources issues to ensure the formal Place Survey (due this Autumn) is delivered effectively.
- To test how residents will react to the survey in terms of format, questions, response rate and use of Charnwood Together branding.
- Provide us with some information / intelligence on local issues and priorities within our priority neighbourhoods which will allow us to establish a baseline from which to develop a programme of engagement.

2. Executive Summary

2.1 Methodology

The methodology chosen followed the principles of those set out in Communities and Local Government (CLG) Consultation Document on the proposed Place Survey 2008.

2.1.1 Survey Type

As prescribed for the national survey, a postal questionnaire was used. CLG have decided that there should be a single methodology for this survey to allow results nationally to be compared fairly with each other. Where different authorities use different methodologies the results cannot be fairly compared as some (such as face-to-face) tend to generate a more positive response. It was felt that if authorities chose their own methodologies, those with the most resources would get more positive results than those with fewer resources. So, it was decided that postal would be the most cost effective way of levelling the playing field.

2.1.2 Sample Method

A random sample of Charnwood addresses within the 5 priority neighbourhood areas was drawn from the Post Office small users address file (PAF). A list of the streets within these areas (including monitoring areas) was provided by the Community Strategy Support Officers.

2.1.3 The Questionnaire

The questionnaire is based on the draft questions issued as part of the consultation for the national survey. Further, locally focused questions were added to allow us to collect information on local priorities, key concerns and to gather intelligence on issues we already know are relevant to the priority neighbourhoods (e.g. access to transport, healthy eating). These local additions were agreed in consultation with Cllr Richard Shepherd (Chair of Charnwood Together and Leader of Charnwood Borough Council); Steve Phipps, Director of Partnerships and Customer Services at CBC and the Council's Community Strategy Support Officers. The proposal was also put before the Neighbourhood Management Priority Neighbourhood Management Sub Group.

2.2 Response Rate

2.2.1 Sample Size

A total of **2700** surveys were sent out.

2.2.2 Response Rate Achieved

A total of **551** valid responses were received overall, giving a response rate of **20%**

The following table is a breakdown of these responses by priority neighbourhood area:

A further 11 responses were received after the deadline. Whilst the statistical responses for late responses have not been included in this report, any written comments received will be added to those received within deadline.

2.2.3 Reliability of Results

The minimum required response rate set (by CBC) for Charnwood is 500. At this level we can begin to say that to some extent the results will be reflective of the views of the wider population. This is – of course – subject to a confidence interval (which basically means the margin of error) of around 4%.

The most commonly used confidence interval means that 95 times out of a 100 your results will be reliable and representative of the wider population with a margin of error based on the number of responses received. So, if the response to a question produces a result of 76% satisfied based on 500 people responding we can be confident that if we asked every one in the priority neighbourhoods rather than a random sample the result would at worst be 72% and at best 80%.

The larger the sample, the more accurate the results become (e.g. The confidence interval for 1000 responses is around 2 % either way).

This should be born in mind when considering the results of this survey. It should be considered a “snap shot of views” and a general indicator rather than a true reflection of the views of the population surveyed. Further consultation and engagement is likely to be required if you want an in-depth, truer picture of any particular issues / themes arising.

3. Main Findings

This section identifies the main findings of the survey. The information shown is in an un-weighted format. In addition to quantitative (statistical) responses, key themes to emerge from free response written comments are included. (a full list of these comments will be available on request).

Comparisons have also been made in relation to questions that as well as appearing in this survey also appeared in the 06-07 BVPI General Survey. When looking at these comparisons it is worth noting that the sample used for the BVPI was random and spread out across the Borough rather than being focused on certain areas as with this survey.

3.1 Statistical Findings

- When asked what made an area a good place to live respondents placed low level of crime; clean streets; locally accessible health services and affordable decent housing at the top.
- When asked what most needed improving in their local area the top areas were the level of crime; traffic congestion; clean streets and activities for teenagers.
- In the 06-07 bvpi Survey the things identified as most needing improvement were the level of traffic congestion (26.8% of respondents); Activities for Teenagers (25.7%); The Level of Crime (25.4%) and Clean Streets (19.7%)
- 58.2% of respondents felt a sense of belonging to their neighbourhood.
- 61% were to some extent satisfied with the local area as a place to live. In the 06-07 BVPI General Survey carried out by CBC 71% of respondents were satisfied with their local area as a place to live.
- When it came to satisfaction with the cleanliness of streets and roads more were dissatisfied (42.7%) than satisfied (35.9%). In 06-07 a similar question asked respondents how satisfied they were that we had kept public land clear of refuse and litter (63% were satisfied).

- When asked if they felt able to influence local decision making only 16.1% agreed. In addition to this, 62.5% didn't feel well informed about how to get involved in local decision making.
- In the 06-07 Survey 51% of respondents felt that they couldn't influence decisions affecting the local area and 20% thought they could.
- A majority of respondents also didn't feel well informed about what local agencies are spending their money on (60.5%) or about the standard of service they can expect to receive (64.3%).
- 68.8% of respondents don't feel well informed about what local agencies are doing to tackle local problems and 67.8% don't feel well informed about how local agencies are performing.
- The most significant ASB issues in respondents local area were rubbish and litter lying around (55% see this as a problem); Abandoned or burnt out vehicles (49%) and teenagers hanging around the streets (48.7%)
- 37.2% of respondents think that the Police and Council are dealing with asb / crime in their area. However, 26.5% disagree and a further 36% gave a neutral (neither) answer.
- A majority of respondents thought that there wasn't a "respect" problem in their local area (57.5%) but a significant 42.3% did.

3.2 Key Themes of Comments

- Parking - (hard to find spaces in Loughborough and need for residents only parking).
- lack and frequency of bus services
- Street cleaning is inadequate to deal with volume of litter / rubbish
- ASB (especially litter, drugs, noise)
- Teenagers hanging around, causing disturbance (and lack of facilities for young people)
- Poorly maintained paths and pavements.
- Traffic Congestion

3.3 Key Variations between Priority Areas

In general, there appears to be a lot of consistency across the priority neighbourhoods in terms of problems and priorities

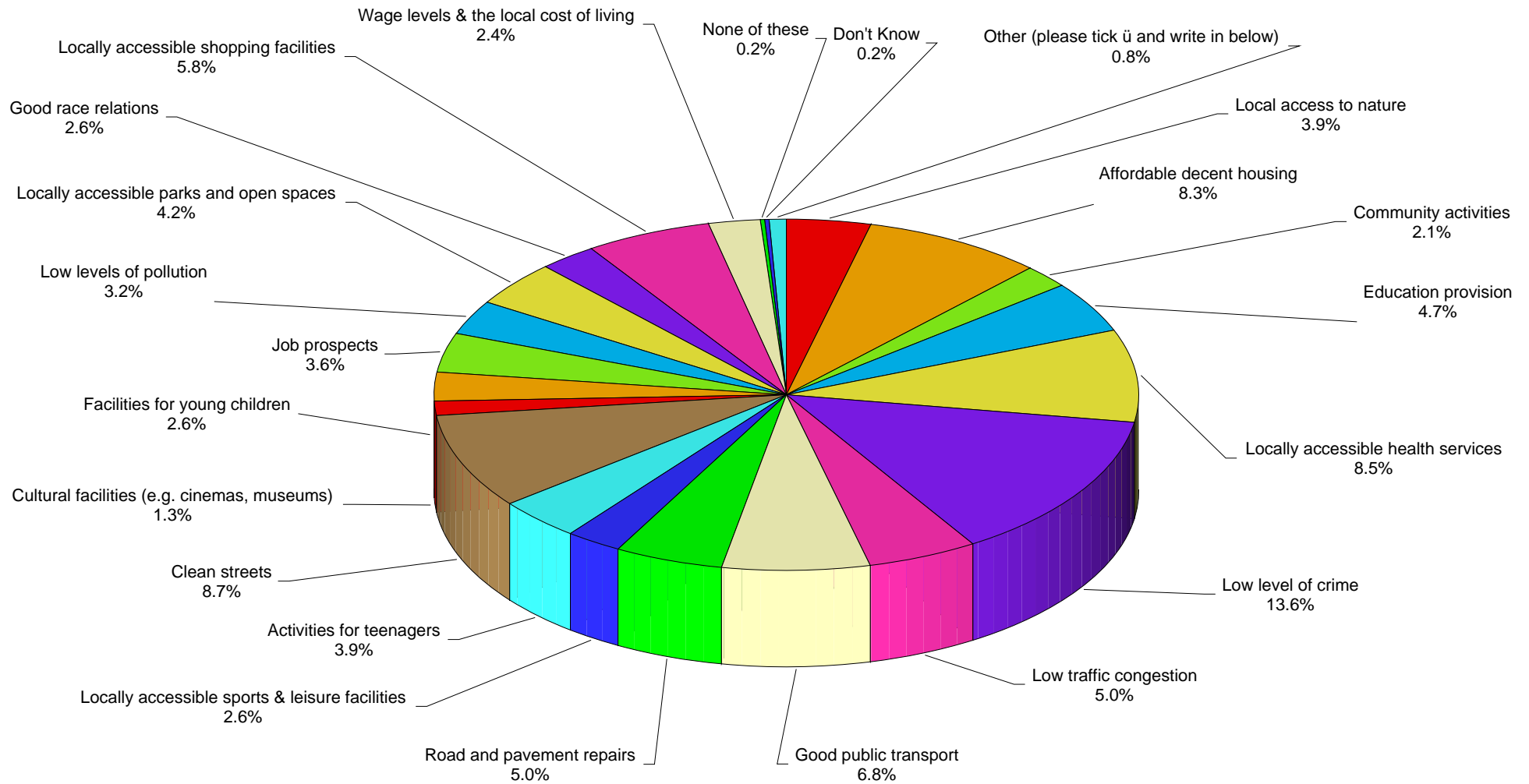
If we look at the top priorities within each priority neighbourhoods come out as:

- Syston - Traffic, Activities for teenagers
- Mountsorrel – Crime, Activities for teenagers.

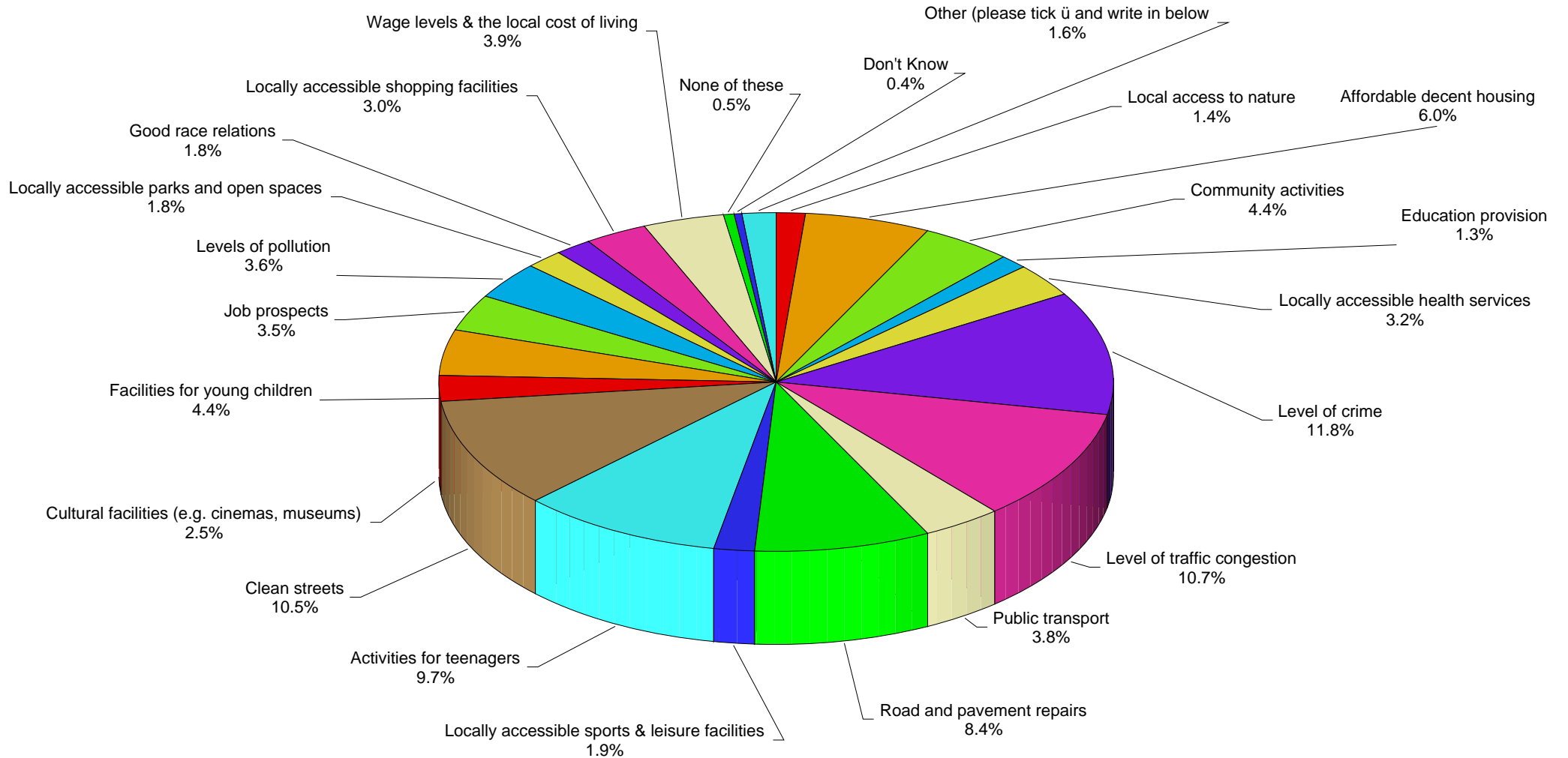

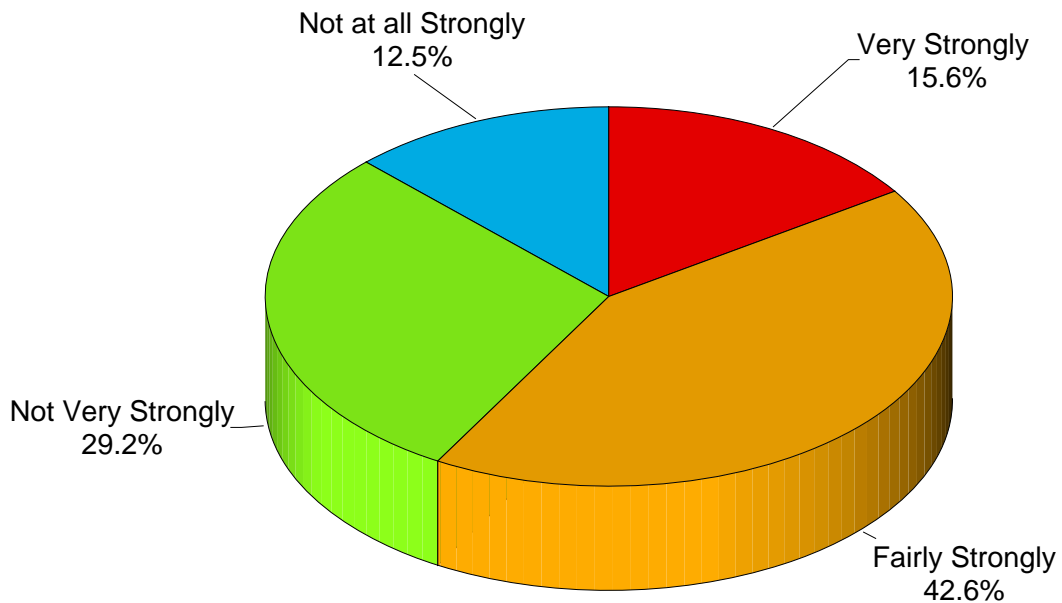
Q1 Thinking generally, which of the things below would you say are most important in making somewhere a good place to live?



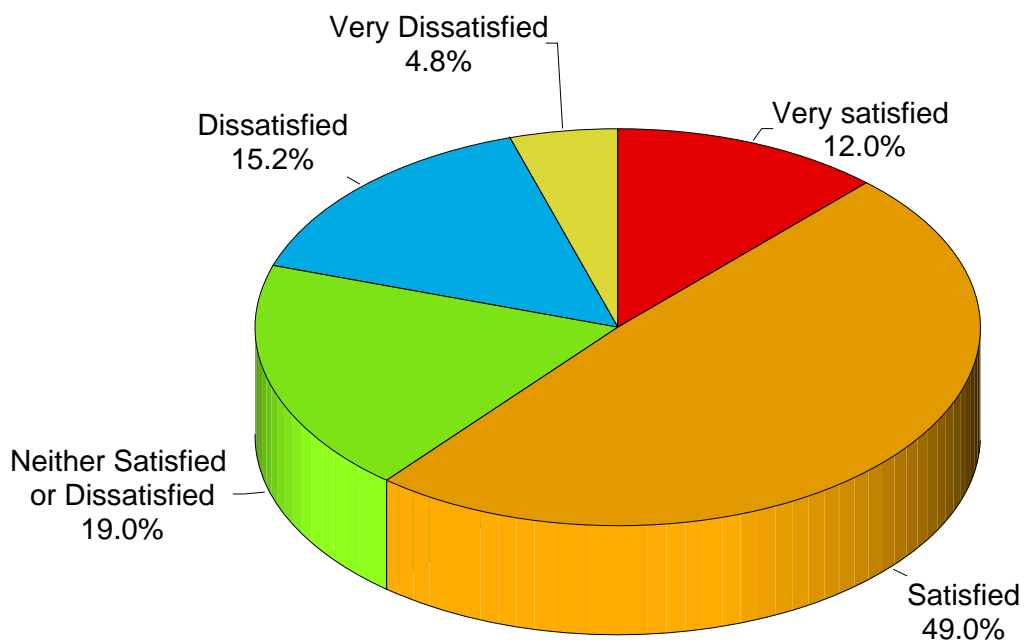
Q2 And which of these would you say most need improving in the local area where you live?



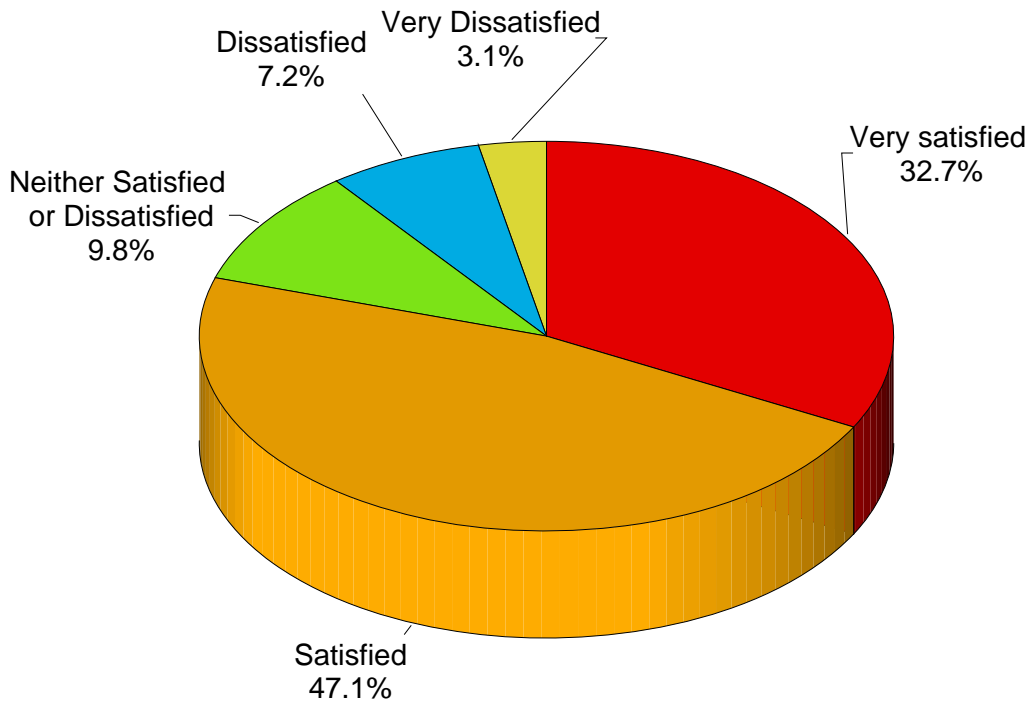

5. Recommendations

5.1 Actioning Outcomes

It is recommended that the Priority Neighbourhood Management Sub Group develop an action plan to address the issues raised in the survey – identifying timescales, responsibility, action required and how the process will be monitored.

5.2 Baseline the “Bigger Picture”.

It is recommended that the Priority Neighbourhood Management Sub Group brings the results of this survey together with previously collected data on the priority neighbourhoods to develop a baseline picture. As well as the statistical evidence this should include any anecdotal comments received.

This will allow the group to say “This is what the statistics say; this is what local people are saying – is it the same picture?” This can then be used to

identify gaps between the two and stimulate further work to explore why this is the case.

5.3 Engagement Strategy

It is recommended that the Neighbourhood Management Priority Neighbourhood Management Sub Group develops and implements a comprehensive engagement strategy / action plan. This should include addressing the following key elements of engagement:

- Informing – How we will communicate information.
- Consulting – How will gather views and ideas to shape service delivery.
- Involving – How we can get local people actively involved in shaping services.
- Devolving – How we can hand over responsibility for service delivery to the community.

6. Conclusion

The results of this survey have provided us with some useful information but they are only one piece of the jigsaw.
