I would like to state in writing that once again I fully object to the outline application for up to 150 dwellings on Barkby Road. There has already been significant new building in and around Queniborough, Syston and Barkby, and this has resulted in extreme pressure on an already limited infrastructure e.g.,

- 1. Increase in traffic making the local roads busier, making driving more dangerous, impacting negatively on road safety, increasing the noise and air pollution.
- 2. Spoiling a lovely green area and natural environment with many public footpaths for walkers, dog walkers, children etc.
- 3. Insufficient shops to cater for more residents.
- 4. Negative impact on already full medical surgeries.
- 5. I believe the negative impact on the local environment far outweigh the benefit of more housing.
- 6. There is simply no need for further development in our already crowded environment. We have already had numerous new developments in the last decade.
- 7. Detrimental impact on the local amenities. By amenity I mean "an element of a location or neighbourhood that helps to make it attractive or enjoyable for residents and visitors". Queniborough and Barky are stunning and picturesque Charnwood village. Why continue to spoil this and turn the whole area into an urban ghetto?
- 8. I think you have a responsibility to protect the living standards of local residents. Please do so by refusing this application.
- 9. Negative effect on the character and appearance of our villages. This may be subjective but a further 150 dwellings will significantly alter the way of life, the pattern of living and the health and welfare of the local people.
- 10. There will inevitably be traffic generation and increased pressure on existing car parking in and around the new buildings.
- 11. There is already limited public transport. More cars will merely result in more traffic problems.
- 12. We must do everything we can to protect our green belt land.
