YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

Further to my comments via email on 10th and 13th June 2022 I would like to make the inspector aware of the current situation regarding health care for the area. As stated, the 2 Doctors Surgeries in Syston are under tremendous pressure to provide urgent and routine appointments, indeed a non - urgent appointment can take anything from 2 to 3 weeks.

Typically they are saying that the waiting times for certain procedures are as follows:

Cardiology 11 to 12 Months

Cardiology 20 Months

Urogynaecology 15 to 18 Months

Gastroenterology 12 to 14 Months

Dermatology 12 Months

General Medicine 5 to 6 Months

Respiratory/Spirometry 5 to 6 Months/9 Months

Radiology 6 to 8 Months

There are other community health services that also show excessive wait times: such as Ultrasound, Echocardiogram, Community Paediatrics, CAMHS, Adult ASD/ADHD and Transgender Service.

The granting of this application for a further 150 houses (and a possible extra 300 people minimum) would have a severe impact on the health service in the area. The wait times shown are for the current level of the population in the area, any increase would surely impact on them.

I understand also that Nationally there is a shortage of GP's so that any amount of money paid to the Surgeries under the S106 scheme would solve the problem.

If there are NO Doctor's available, then any money paid by the developers would have very little effect. I feel that this application should once and for all be REJECTED
