Recommendation

To approve the provision of support for the re-opening of facilities and businesses in the borough of Charnwood as part of the government's roadmap, using the Covid Contain Fund. The support will include:

High Street Ambassador, 37 hours a week, 1st April to 30th June 2021 (extension of existing temporary post via Matrix). Approximate cost £8k

Charnwood Helpers (Casual post) various dates 29th March to 20th June 2021. Cost per hour £13.37, minimum of 2 hours per shift.

Provision of professional stewards to support Covid-19 safety compliance in the hospitality industry and public spaces as required during the period 1st April to 30th June 2021. Cost of Supervisor £16 per hour, Steward 14.50 per hour. Minimum of 6 hours per shift.

The estimated total cost of this provision, based on the attached deployment calendar, is £33k. Management of these resources will be via the Business Support Manager, post no. H589, in liaison with the Covid Safety Group.

Reason

As businesses open and shoppers return to our towns and villages, in accordance with the Government's Covid-19 Roadmap for lifting restrictions, support to maintain public safety and business recovery through advice and monitoring will be needed.

Authority for Decision

Under Section 8 of Constitution the Head of Paid Service (Chief Executive) has delegated authority to agree changes to the establishment, within budget and without major operational disruption or interruption or services or involving a change from direct to indirect provision or vice versa or other policy implications. This has been further sub-delegated by the Chief Executive to Strategic Directors/Heads of Service in certain circumstances (DD 002 021 refers)). These proposals fall within the limit of the authority of the relevant Head of Service.
