Decision and Date

Background

The Charnwood Borough Council Health and Safety Enforcement Policy will be reviewed on an annual basis or when there are significant changes to policy from the HSE under Section 18 guidance. This details how health and safety enforcement service will be delivered to those premises where we have an enforcement responsibility and refers to the Corporate Enforcement Policy and Regulatory Services Enforcement Policy, which details the enforcement options and approach adopted by the Council. The current Enforcement Policy is due for revision to incorporate relevant changes and make sure it is

line with the Council's Corporate Enforcement Policy 2017. Some minor amendments have been made to reflect changes in job roles and updates to the Corporate Complaints Procedure and to include a document control facility. Amendments have been also been made to ensure that the revised policy appropriately reflects the Council's Corporate Enforcement Policy.

The Lead Member for Regulatory Services, Cllr Smidowicz, has been consulted on the draft Policy and has confirmed she is in agreement with the amendments proposed.
