Reason

To enable section 106 monies that has been received for the provision of Children's Play facilities in Barrow to be spent.

Authority to pay over Section 106 monies in respect of non-housing items received by the Borough Council as the responsible authority, but which will not result in expenditure by the Council and where the Head of Service has been determined to be the relevant Head of Service by the Head of Finance and Property Services. (item 8 of the delegations to Heads of Service in section 8.3 of the Constitution)

(For the Head of Service to approve the release of funds they must be satisfied that the works to be carried out fulfil the requirements set out in the S 106 agreement and have written confirmation from the relevant body that the monies will be used for their intended purpose).

Background

Under the provisions of the Corporate Plan to 2020 - 24, there is a commitment to ensure that a growth in homes and infrastructure benefits residents through improved services and facilities.

Planning agreements negotiated with developers and land owners under Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) provide a vehicle for the delivery of contributions towards infrastructure, facilities and amenities which should be:

- Necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms
- Directly related to the development
- Fairly and reasonable related in scale and kind to the development

Detail

Within Barrow there are a number of Section 106 agreements that have been negotiated, with contributions for Children's Play, Community Facilities and Youth and Adult Recreation.

Barrow Parish Council have been working on several schemes to improve community facilities, including the provision of additional children's play facilities within the village to meet identified local need.

Barrow Parish Council with the help of volunteers have consulted widely on the proposed Play Area and there is good community support for the project. Ward Councillors have been consulted and are supportive.

The Parish Council have, in partnership with residents, designed an inclusive and imaginative scheme to meet local need. The new Mill Lane Play Area will provide a range of new play equipment, offering a variety of activities and play experiences. The equipment includes items that will be accessible to children with extra needs. The Play Area has been designed to offer inclusive opportunities for family recreation and fencing will make the site safer for users. The new Play Area has been themed around a narrowboat/river theme linking it to the adjoining towpath walk, river soar and wider greenspace/blue corridor network.

The improvement of Mill Lane Play Area is a priority in terms of improving the quality of children's play provision in Barrow. The 2017 Open Spaces Assessment Study (Nortoft) identified the site as having the lowest score for quality, accessibility, safety, and condition.

Barrow has had a significant amount of housing growth in the last few years and this is putting pressure on existing community facilities. This project will create a much needed children's play facility in an excellent location to serve residents. The money was secured with the intention of meeting the needs of children in Barrow and the project achieves this. The scheme is in a position to be delivered quickly and the positive outcomes for the community realised.

Many hours of both Parish Council paid hours and volunteer hours have gone into the project and have been taken as an in-kind contribution.

There is a high risk that if this project does not go ahead the Section 106 funding currently secured for Children's Play through P/14/0790/2 & P/13/1023/2 will not be spent within the required time limits (June 2022 & Jan

2023 respectively) and the money would have to be paid back under the terms of the legal agreement.

Officers are satisfied that the scheme meets the criteria for the use of the Section 106 monies. The money will not be released to Barrow Parish Council until invoices have been received to ensure verification that the money has been spent.

Barrow Parish Council has provided information in relation to this project including s106 proforma, evidence of security of tenure, confirmation of the management arrangements for the facility.
