(For the Head of Service to approve the release of funds they must be satisfied that the works to be carried out fulfil the requirements set out in the S106 agreement and have written confirmation from the relevant body that the monies will be used for their intended purpose).

Background

Under the provisions of the Corporate Plan to 2020 - 24, there is a commitment to ensure that a growth in homes and infrastructure benefits residents through improved services and facilities.

Planning agreements negotiated with developers and land owners under Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) provide a vehicle for the delivery of contributions towards infrastructure, facilities and amenities which should be:

- Necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms
- Directly related to the development
- Fairly and reasonable related in scale and kind to the development

Detail

Charnwood Borough Council is holding £7,117.05 received as part of a Section 106 agreement attached to P/05/2846/2 for the provision or enhancement of youth/adult recreation facilities in Loughborough.

Environmental Services will use this contribution to pay for the purchase and installation of free to use fitness and callisthenic equipment in an area of high need. The equipment will encourage active recreation and physical wellbeing, providing a facility close to where people live and responding to high demand. The equipment offers the opportunity to workout and socialise. High quality strength and dynamic exercise equipment will provide a superior street workout and callisthenics experience, appealing to young people and adults.

The monies will be used to supplement monies already committed through DD099 2020 for the Bell Foundry Pocket Park project. £17,229.44 of Section 106 money received form P/05/0964/2 has already been allocated to the scheme and this additional sum will ensure that works can be completed and a quality youth/adult facility provided.

The total cost of the equipment purchase and installation is £24,346.49.
