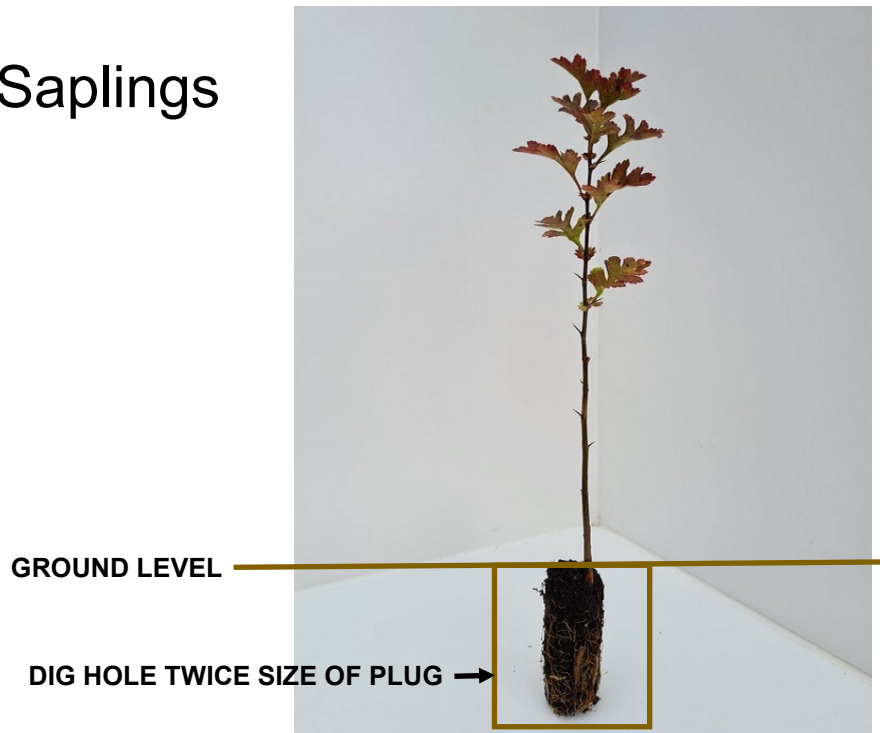


Planting Tips

Cell-grown Saplings



Plan where your tree will go. Account for growth and be mindful of established plants within your garden that may be shaded in the future by your new tree. Prepare the ground by removing any other vegetation. If you're planting in a turfed area, remove a square of turf before planting. Avoid planting your tree where it may become water-logged. Your tree will need good drainage, sunlight and protection from strong winds.

- Dig a hole twice the size of the plug using a trowel or bulb planter
- Place the tree plug in the hole and place approx. 1cm lower than the surrounding ground level. Make sure that it is upright
- Firm soil back around the plug, don't pack too tightly, and be sure to keep the sapling upright during this process
- Water your tree plug well after planting, but try not to over-water

Follow-up Care:

- Water regularly in dry months
- Keep other vegetation back from the immediate surrounding area
- If you use mulch, keep this away from the base of the sapling as this may cause rot
