

Hedgerow Planting Guide

Hedgerows are an important wildlife habitat for our gardens as well as providing a secure boundary. They make a great shelter and provide valuable a food source for birds, insects and mammals. Hedgerows also provide safe routes for our wildlife to travel from one habitat to another.

Planting your hedge, to benefit wildlife, should be in a staggered formation, with each plant given a 50cm gap to allow for growth. Your hedge may look a bit sparse when first planted, but this will soon fill out as it grows.
