Wild Cherry (*Prunus avium*)

Arguably, one of the UK's prettiest native trees. The Wild cherry is more suited to a larger garden as mature trees can grow up to 30m with a life-span of approx. 60 years.

From April, the white blossom will provide pollen and nectar for the bees and come autumn, you'll be rewarded

with vitamin-rich cherries, which also contain antioxidants, if you can beat the birds to the feast! If these fruits do make it to the floor, they will also be enjoyed by mammals.
