

Good afternoon,

Please find the remaining answers to your initial questions.

### **1. Brookside etc.**

Two sites are involved, both with 'Brookside' as part of their name. **Brookside** (reference 2 on Map 3) is designated as Local Green Space in the NP; this is the historical name of the strip of open land bordering the watercourse that is an essential part of the landscape and character of the village. **Brookside recreation ground and play area** (reference 12 on map 3) is designated as Important Open Space in the NP; it appears on the CBC Local Plan (2019 -36 draft) map as 'Church Lane amenity green space' but this is not the name used by Rearsby Parish Council or local people.

### **2. Views**

The descriptions have been reviewed and the viewpoints and arrows revised for accuracy and consistency. Better images have been acquired to represent the views, and map 4 and Appendix c (attached) have been updated to reflect these changes..

### **3. Stables etc. (local heritage list images)**

Images have been inserted and the updated Appendix D is attached.

### **4. Ridge and furrow**

A new paragraph 4.77 has been drafted to provide evidence and justification for Policy R8, sub 4, as follows:

4.77 Historic England, in recognition of the loss nationally since c.1950 of more than 90% of ridge and furrow (the earthworks representing the ploughlands of the medieval open field system), has surveyed the whole country for surviving examples, most recently in 2011-12 (*Turning the Plough update assessment* English Heritage and Gloucs. CC, 2012 ('TTP2')). Leicestershire CC records all surviving ridge and furrow areas recorded in TTP2 in the county as non-designated heritage assets; the Rearsby Neighbourhood Plan re-surveyed the Plan Area to update this information in the Leicestershire Historic Environment Record, and to provide protection through the Planning system for the two survivors. The evidence is presented in Appendix D and the sites' locations are shown on Map 5.

Images and descriptions of the two ridge and furrow sites have also been added to Appendix D, using the same format as the buildings on the Local Heritage Assets list.
